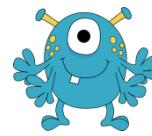




Home Learning

Literacy



Parents - Each week we will do this first activity but I will change the sound that we focus on. This week the sound is 'oo'(as in 'poo at the zoo').

- Use the phonics page for the sound 'oo' that you have in your phonics pack and write some of the 'oo' words at the bottom of the page in sentences. If you can think of anymore 'oo' words you could also write some sentences containing these words or write a list.

When writing sentences please can you help your child to write 'good' sentences.

This means that a 'good' sentence has a capital letter, finger spaces, a full stop, it makes sense and it is written in neat handwriting.

To make the sentence 'even better' they need to write sentences containing more than 5 words, add some simple adjectives and use a conjunction (if appropriate) to extend their sentence. If you can also try to add a verb in your sentences that would make your sentences fantastic.

Parents - This week and next week we are going to be reading and writing about the Three Little Pigs. The children need to know that this is a Traditional Tale but they should already know that. They need to know that the story is very old and most people know the story from when they were told it when they were little. The children should know that it will start with 'Once upon a time...' and end with '....and they all lived happily ever after'.

Literacy continued



- **Activity 1** - Write some speech for the characters from the Three Little Pigs. Use the resource called '**Speech Bubbles - Three Little Pigs**'. Pretend you are each character and write some speech in sentences then draw a speech bubble around your writing. Don't forget your full stops and capital letters.
- **Activity 2** - Using the resource called '**Question words**' (you might already have this printed off from the other week) write some questions that you would ask the characters from the story. Don't forget your capital letters. If you can, pretend to be one of the characters and get someone to ask you the questions and you answer like you are the wolf or one of the pigs.
- **Activity 3** - Using the resource called '**Descriptions - Three Little Pigs**' write some sentences to describe the characters and their houses. Use the resource called '**Adjectives**' (you may have this already printed from the other week) to help with your sentences. Make sure each sentence has a capital letter, finger spaces, neat writing and a full stop.
- **Activity 4** - Act out the story of the Three Little Pigs. You can use the resource titled '**Little Pigs Stick Puppets**' to make stick puppets for all of the characters and houses. There is also a play script called '**Play Script - Three Little Pigs**' that you could use with your adults to act out the story too.

Spellings and Handwriting



This week's spellings are on the resource titled '**Spellings & Handwriting 11.05.20**'

Practise how to spelling each word and at the same time practise their handwriting.

We were really focusing on the formation of letters and that some letters hang under the line and some letters are tall letters.



Reading Comprehension



Read this together with your adult and then answer the comprehension questions that go with it.

There are three sets of questions which start off easy and increase with difficulty. Start with the easy questions and see how far you get answering them.

This week the reading resource is called '**The Three Little Pigs**' and the three sets of questions follow the story.

Numeracy

Parents - At the start of each maths session this week could you please do some rapid recall of additions?

There is a resource called '**Adds facts 6 to 10**' on our page on the website with all of the adds on that the children need to learn. In class we have these on flashcards and I read out the calculation and the children have to quickly say the answer. If you print out the resource and then cut them up the children could choose one at a time to turn over and quickly say the answer. Please could you keep these together as they will be using them each day for five minutes.

Parents - This week we are working on additions. In class we usually put the biggest number in our head then count on the smaller number using our fingers or we find the largest number on a number line or number square and count on the smaller number. There are some number lines on our class website page called '**Number lines to 30 and 100**'.

- **Activity 1** - Complete the additions on the resource titled '**Additions**'.
- **Activity 2** - Use the 'Additions (adds)' resource from your yellow folder. Make up your own additions by choosing a number out of Hoop 1 and a number out of Hoop 2. If you want to use some larger numbers choose a number from your number line to add to a number from either Hoop 1 or Hoop 2.
- **Activity 3** - Complete the resource titled '**Addition Pictures**'.
- **Activity 4** - Complete the resource titled '**Missing Number Additions**'. In class we pretend that we are number detectives and to find the missing number we have to use the clues which are the numbers on the addition. We usually put the largest number in our head and count back the smaller number to find the missing number or we find the largest number on a number line and count back the smaller number to find the missing number.
- **Activity 5** - Use the resource titled '**Addition Word Problems**'. Read the word problem and work out the answer by writing an addition. If you can try and make up your own addition word problems.



Topic Work



Last week you looked at rooms and parts of your house.

This week you need to use your science work on Materials to help you to look at the houses that the Three Little Pigs built because you've got to try to sell them.

You have to pretend that you have got to sell the houses for the Three Little Pigs. A person who normally would sell a house is called an Estate Agent and they would write a description of the house to try to get someone to buy it.

You are now an Estate Agent and you need to write an honest description of each of the houses. Write about what you know about materials for example - is the material the house is made from strong or waterproof? Is the house soft or hard?

Maybe for a couple of the houses you need to say that they might not be too good in strong winds!!



Science Work



Our science topic this term is 'Materials'.

Parents - Following on from the last two week's science lessons, this week we are going to be describing specific materials and looking at what objects around the home are made of.

Use the resource titled '**Alien Invasion - Materials**' and complete the descriptions to describe different types of materials. Water and Glass has already been done for you (you could add to it though) could you describe to the alien what metal, plastic, wood and fabric is like please. If you can think of any more then write these down too.

The next task on the above resource is to describe what materials some objects in your house are made from. Follow the instructions on the sheet. Lots of objects are made up from lots of materials. For example: a cushion - fabric, metal, plastic, fluff for the stuffing.
