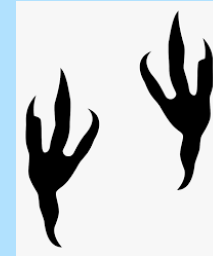

from their footprints?



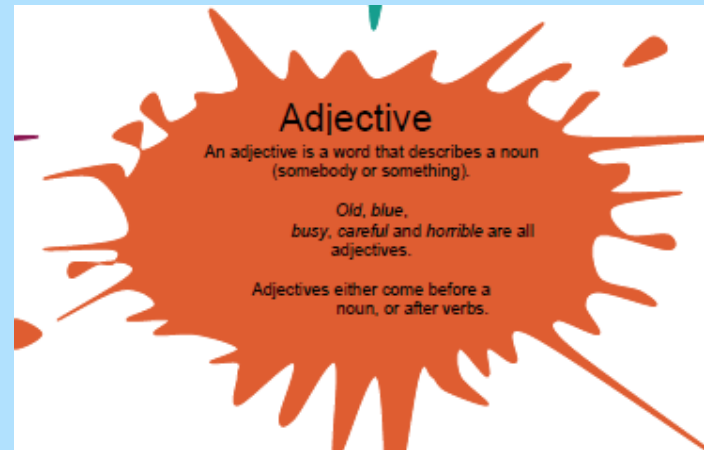


What could this animal be?

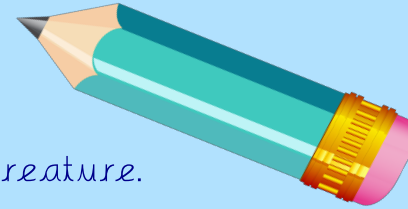
Pick the most relevant adjectives for the animal that we think is missing. We can only have one from each colour, so that there is only one of each type of adjective.
