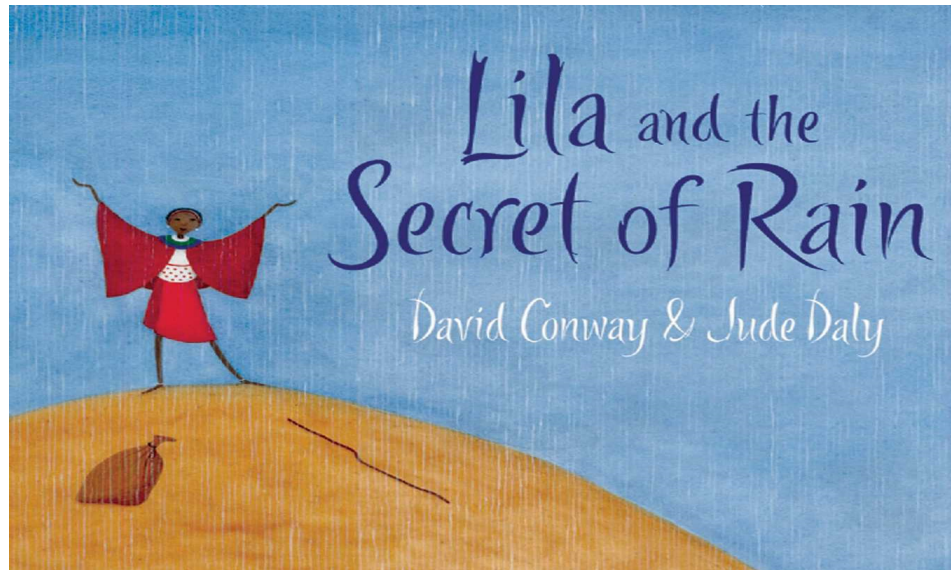

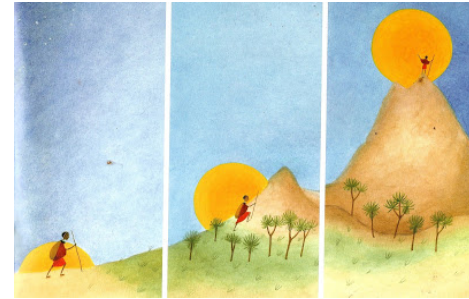

An expanded noun phrase is when you use an adjective to describe a noun.

inky, blue sky

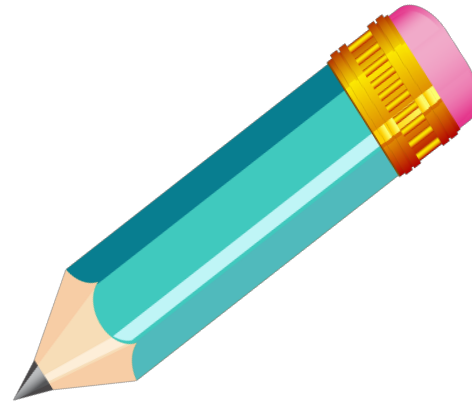
A simile is a description where you compare one thing with another thing of a different kind

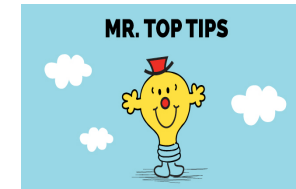
