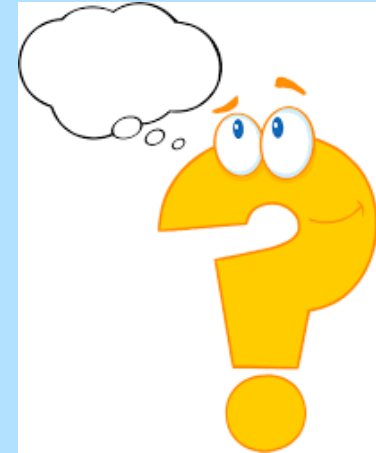

Examples found in our narrative

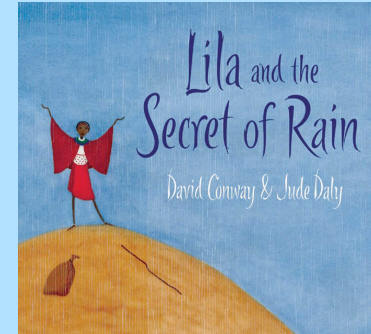
Can you spot the possessive

Your task:

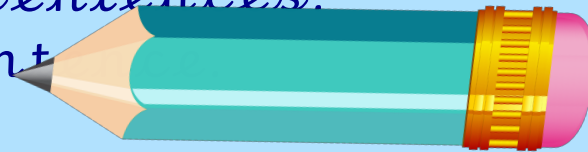
Edit the sentences to include a possessive apostrophe in the correct place.
