W.A.L.T: To use 'how' adverbs to add descriptive detail.

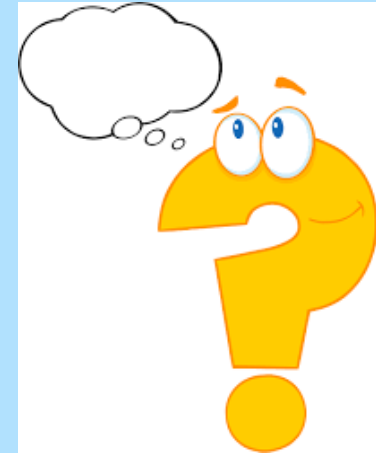
W.I.L.F:

What is a 'how' adverb?



How adverbs: add more detail/describe a verb.

Usually end in the 'ly' suffix.

The girl read her book silently.

Quickly the dog ran to its owner.

The cat quietly purred.

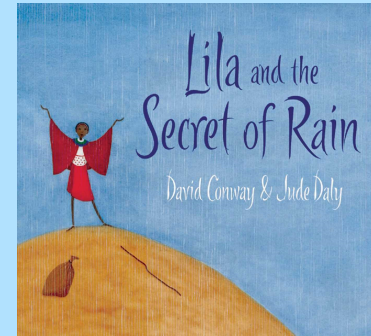
Where do you notice the 'how' adverbs are positioned?

Lila listened very carefully to what her grandfather had said.

...the sun still shone very brightly.

...each raindrop felt like one of her mama's kisses.

Edit the sentences to include a 'how' adverb.

1 star - the how adverb after the verb.
