e.g the boy ran as fast as a rocket

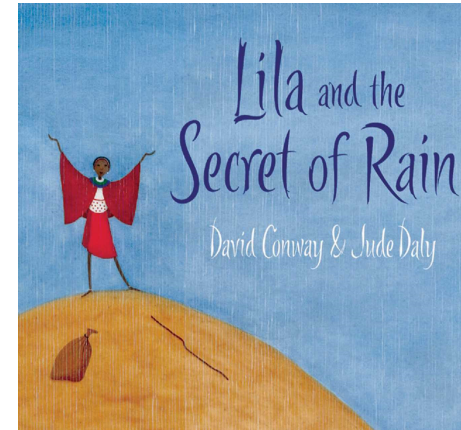
the diamonds twinkled like the stars

Similes use like or as in them to compare.



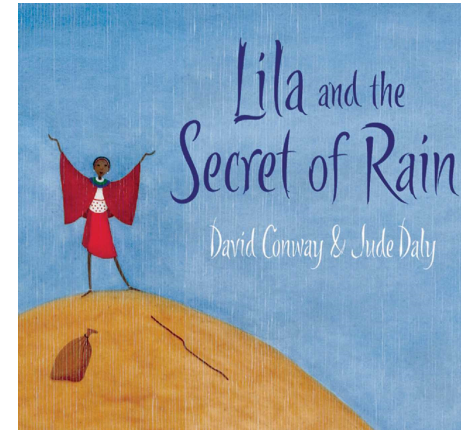
Examples found in our narrative

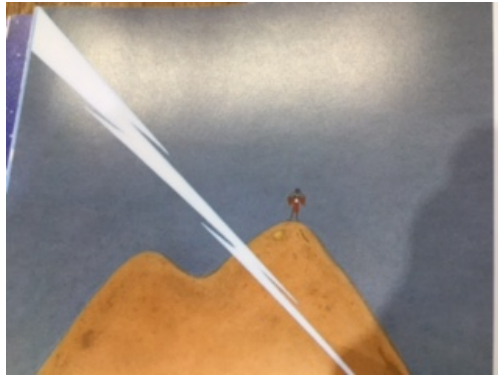
