Apostrophes can show possession. Possession means that something belongs to something else. Read each sentence. Consider how the apostrophe affects each sentence.

The eyes belong to the cheetah = The cheetah's eyes help the cheetah spot its prey from up to 5 km.

The tear lines belong to the cheetah = The cheetah's tear lines protects the cheetah from the harsh sun's rays.

The teeth belong to the cheetah = The cheetah's teeth are sharp and pointy, however they are smaller than other big cat's teeth .
