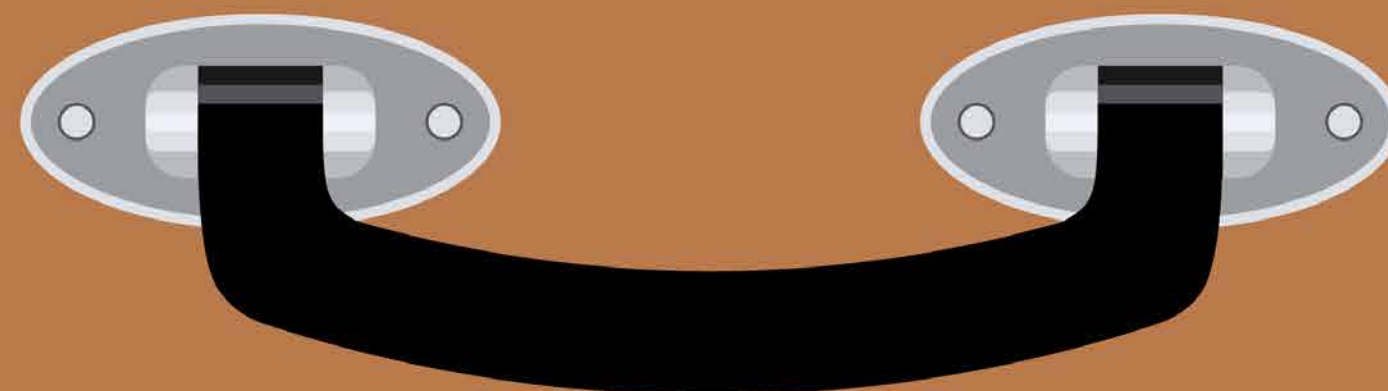


Evacuee Diaries

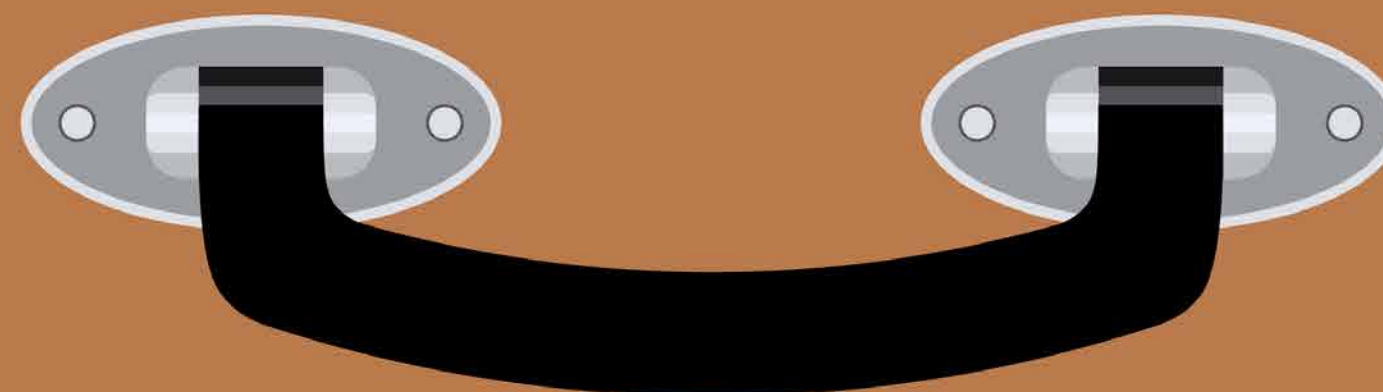
Learning Objective:

Pretend as if you are writing in your diary in the evening, having arrived at your host family's house .

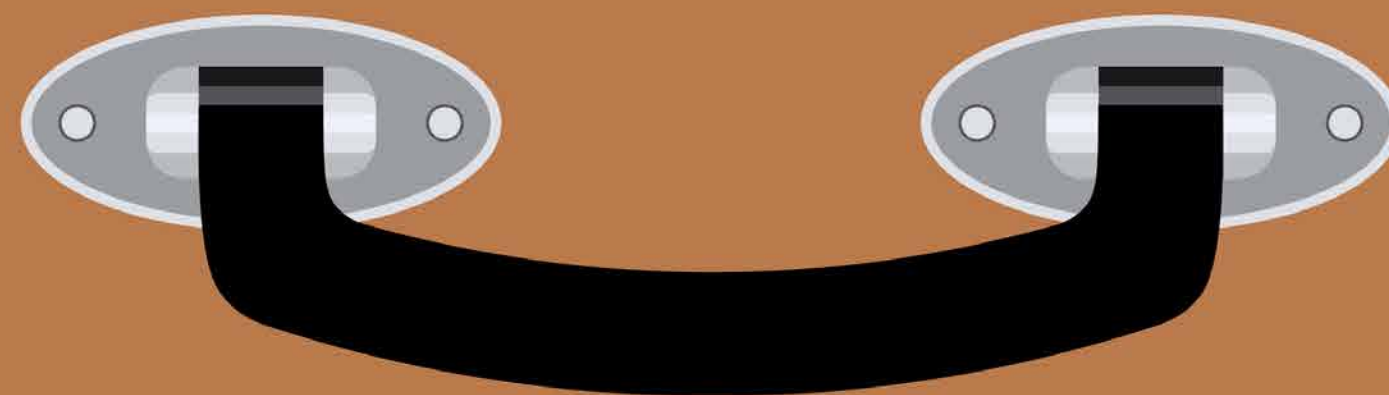

Is your character excited or nervous about being evacuated?



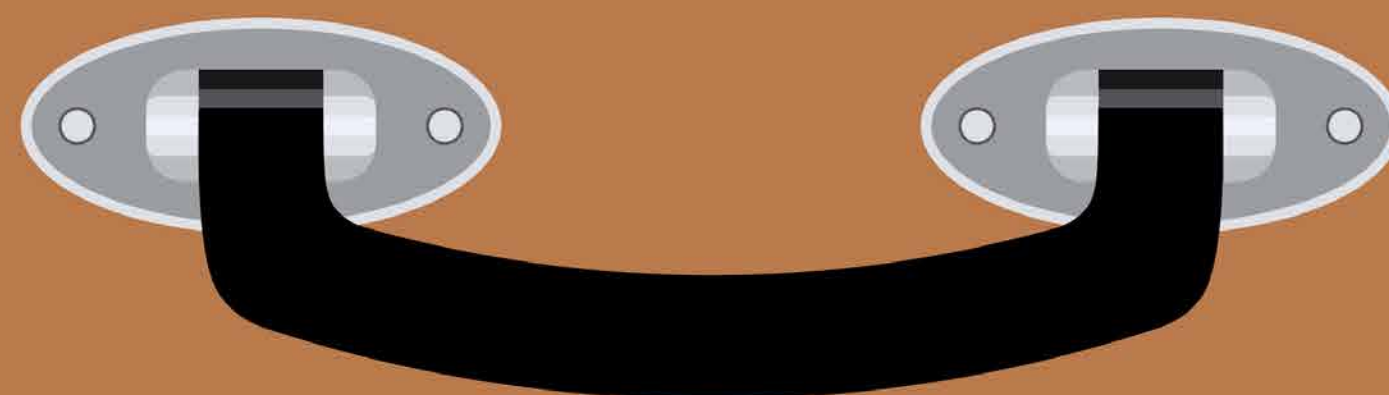

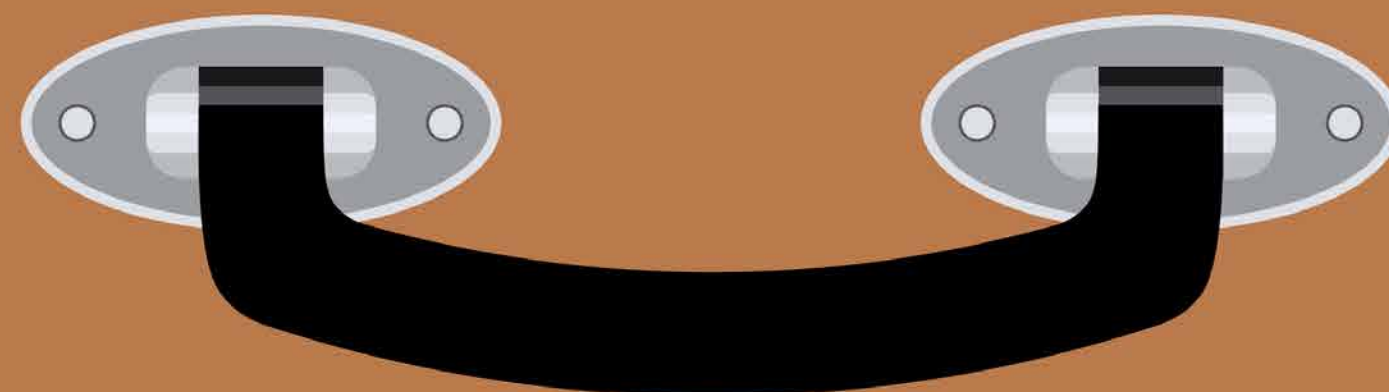

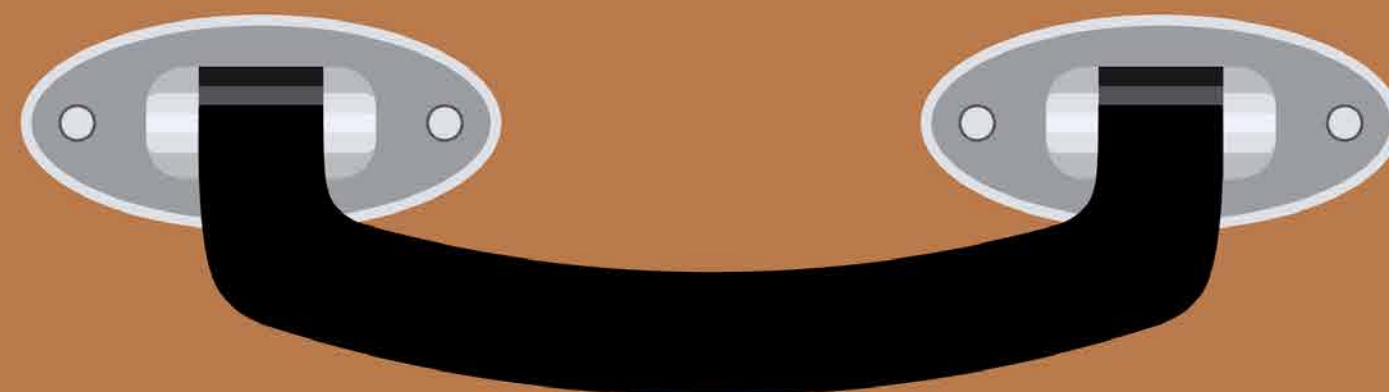
The boy was chosen first.

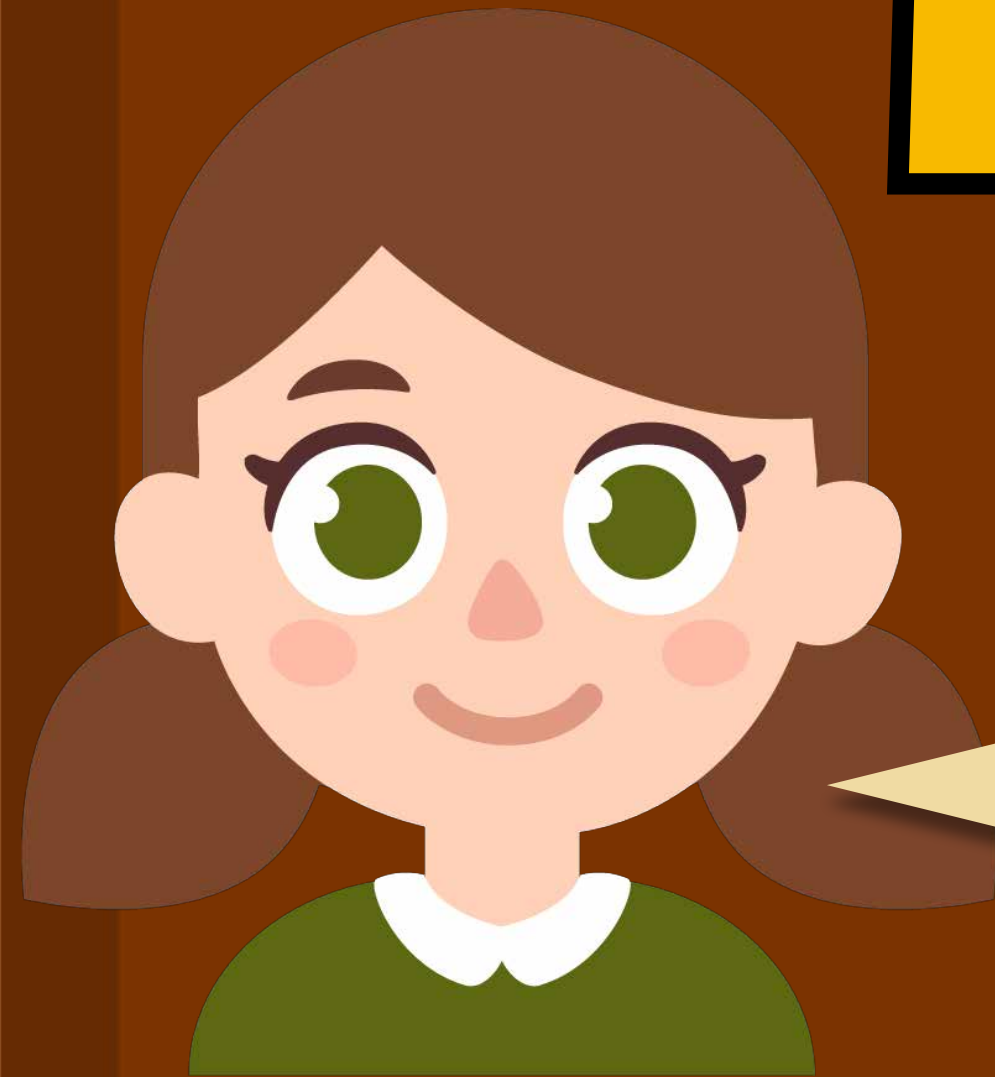

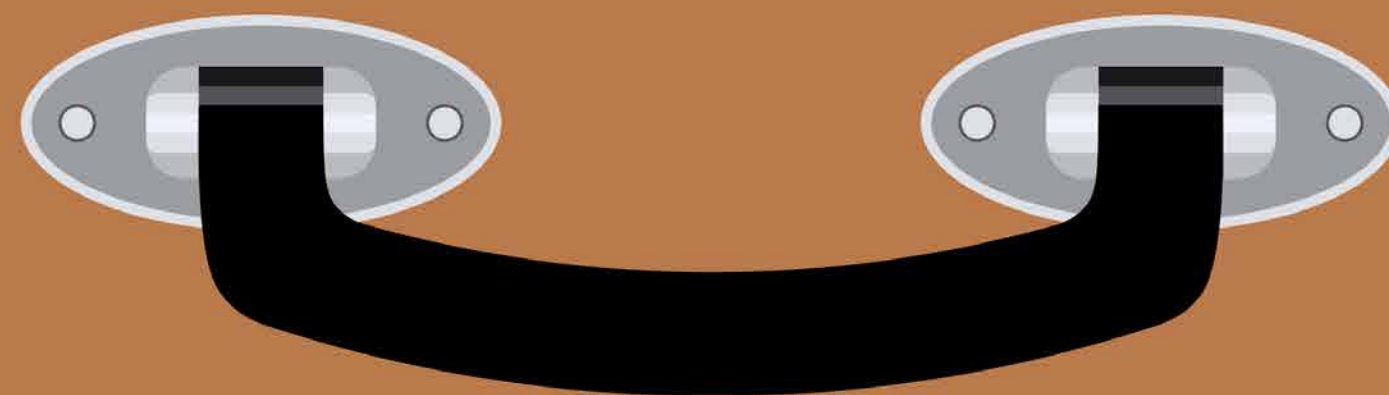


Can you remember your TiP ToP paragraphs?

TiP ToP



Each part of TiP ToP tells you when to start a new paragraph. Can you remember each part?



Time

When there is a hop forwards (or backwards) in time, you need a new paragraph.

Topic

When the topic being discussed changes you need to use a new paragraph.

TOP

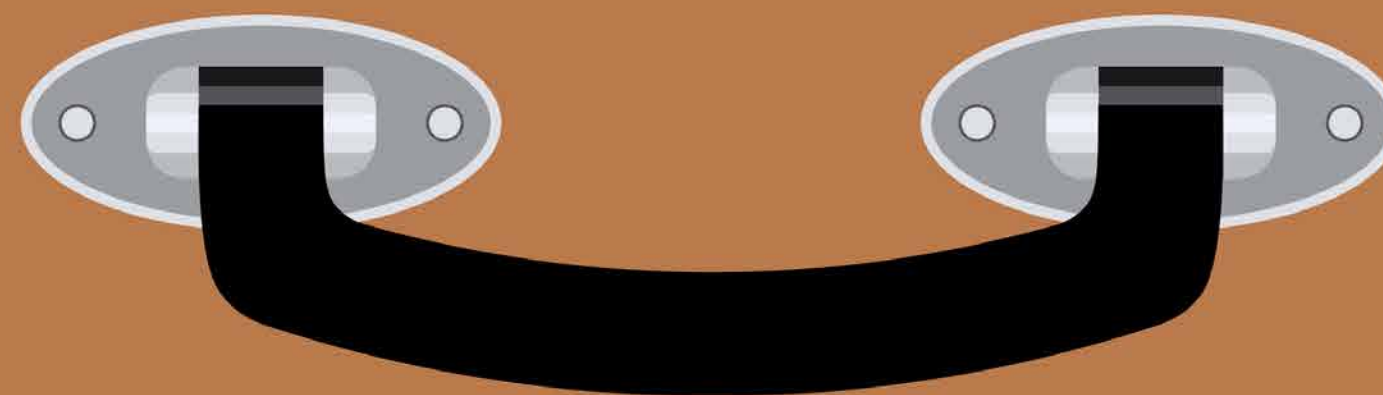
Place

When the setting of your narrative changes, so does the paragraph.

Person

When a new person speaks, you should use a new paragraph.

Clearly show your new paragraph by leaving a line between each pair of paragraphs.





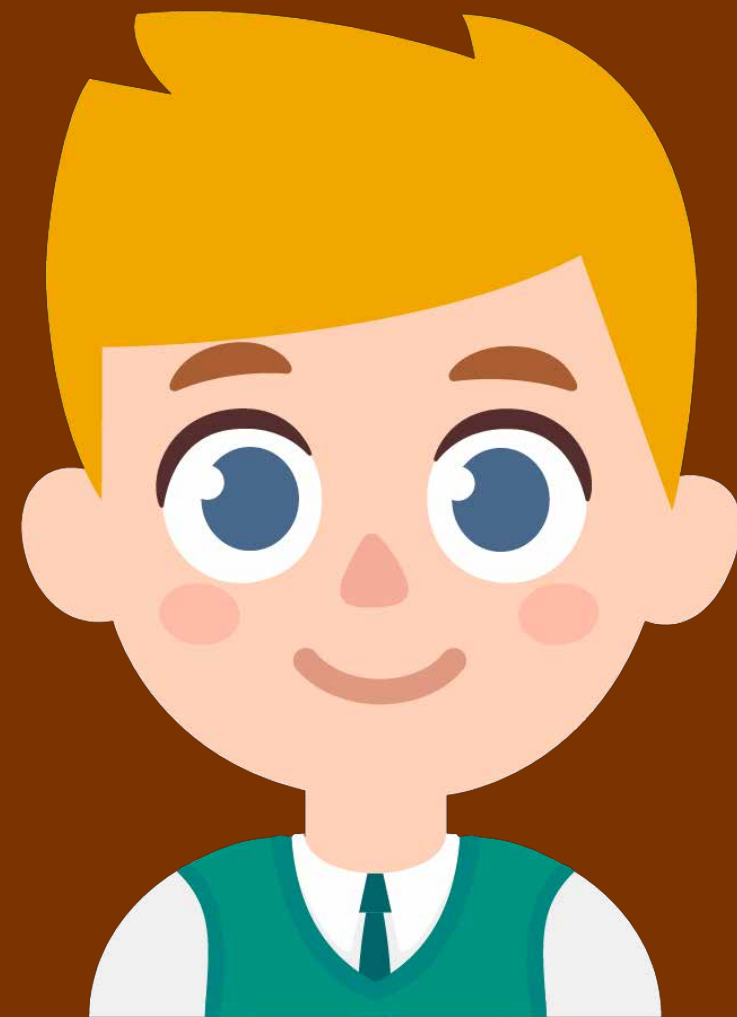
