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Maths

- This week we are reviewing learning on Fractions and Decimals and beginning to look at reasoning and arithmetic tests once more, so that all skills learnt throughout the year can be practiced and refreshed.
- If you have any fractions and decimals work to catch up on from the last few weeks, feel free to do this now.
- Please complete some activities from the **Maths Fractions Home Learning Booklet**
- Please work through Arithmetic Test 1 and 2 - Please take up to 25 minutes for each test (**Maths Y4 Arithmetic Full Test 1 and 2**)

- Have a go at **Maths Y4 Reasoning Test 1 Set A** - What areas of the test did you struggle with? What do we need to work on in the next few weeks to help you improve your scores? Let me know and I can make sure I give some extra work on that area of Maths. You can have up to 50 minutes to complete this test.
- As always, please continue working on your times tables, the more confident you are at your times tables, the easier you may find your Maths!
- Why not have a go at a **Times Tables 5 Minute Frenzy**? How long does it take you to complete the grid? How many can you get right in 5 minutes? I have put 3 in this week, just in case you want chance to improve your score! Good Luck.
- If you like using the White Rose Maths and BBC Bitesize Maths, please feel free to stick with these, this week's focus is on Money. If you would like me to download the White Rose Sheets for you then let me know and I can get that done.

Writing

- This week you will be researching, planning and writing a newspaper article about the start of WW2.

Reading

- There are a few options for your Reading Tasks this week and you can once again choose the activities which suit you best, just remember that try to complete at least one task every day.
- Reading Tasks this week includes:
 - The next **News Four Stories** newspaper articles and comprehensions.
 - **Reading War Child** - Series of comprehension questions based upon a Non-Fiction text about Children during WW2
 - **Reading Buster's Blitz** on Purple Mash and completing online quiz after each chapter
- Continue to read for pleasure and take the opportunity to read aloud to others. Please make sure you are recording your reading in your Journals and having a go at a Reading Journal activity once you have completed a book.

Spellings

- Keep practicing the Year 3/4 statutory spellings
- Complete **Spelling Word Search 6**

Science

- Continue working through your **Science Tasks PART A and B** based on the Topic on Materials, States of Matter and Changes which can be found in last week's resources.

Topic

- Explore what life was like for a child in WW2 by working through a range of tasks and activities found in **Class 4's WW2 Home Learning Project**.
- This project should last you till the end of the term and I don't expect you to complete all the activities even then, just try to complete one or two tasks each week if possible.
