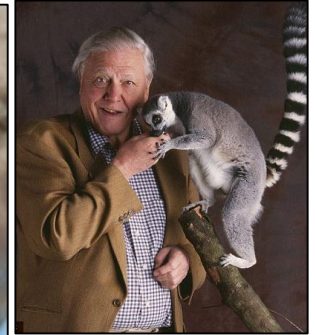
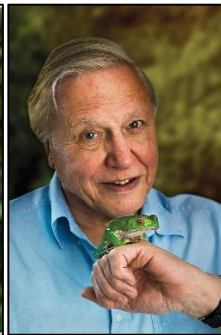

Skywalker Monkey Among 157 New Species Discovered

- Where is the Greater Mekong Region?
- What animals were found in 2017?
- What threats does the area face?

157 new [species](#) of animals and plants were found in a region of south-east Asia last year.

These include a catfish which looks like a pancake and the Skywalker hoolock gibbon.

This is a monkey named after Jedi Master Luke Skywalker, a character in the Star Wars films.

It usually keeps itself out of sight, hiding in the treetops.

The Greater Mekong Region has huge [biodiversity](#), including around 1200 types of bird and 20,000 species of plants.

However, this area is under threat. [Deforestation](#), climate change and [poaching](#) means that many of these animals are at risk.

Lots is being done to protect this habitat. Charities, such as the WWF, are working with the local people to preserve the forests and the animals which live in them.

If we work together to look after this region, who knows what amazing wildlife we might find in the future?
