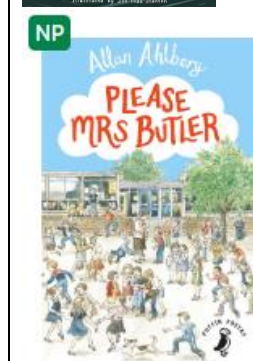
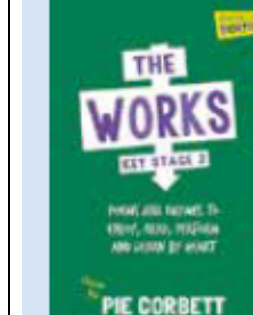
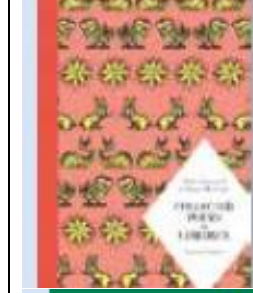
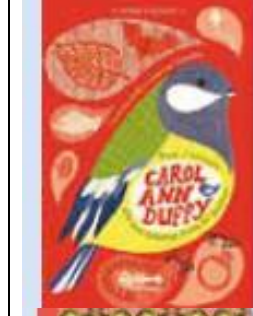
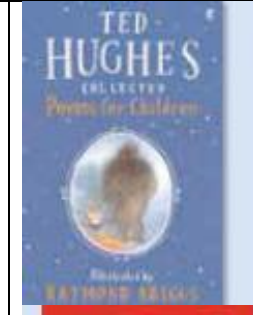
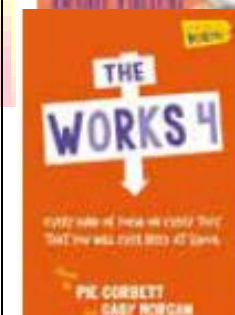
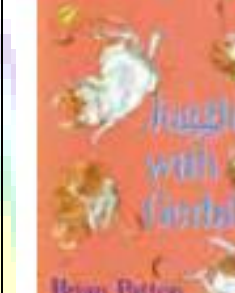
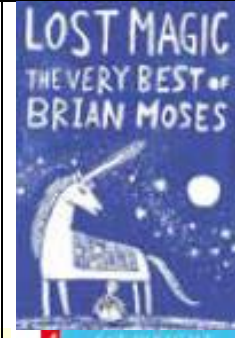
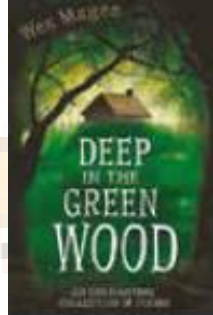
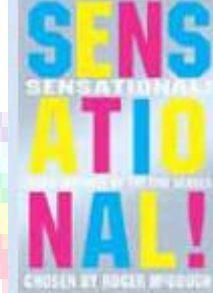
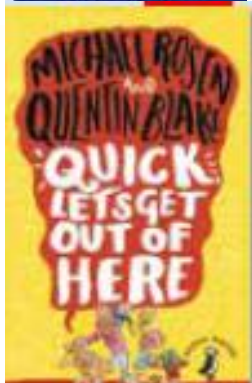
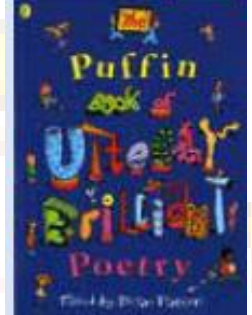
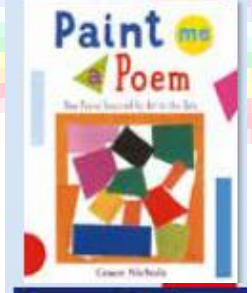
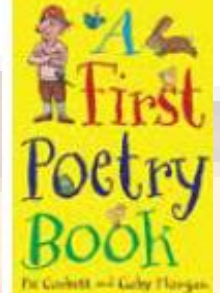
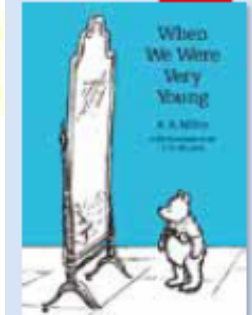
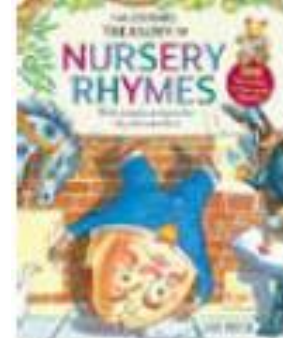
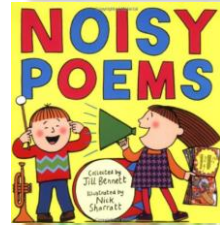
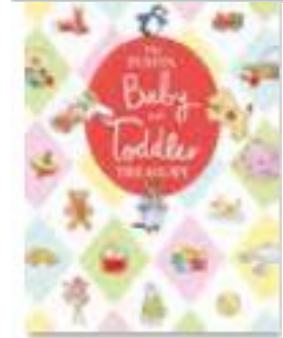
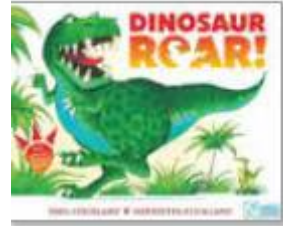
Books at Gawber are selected carefully. Leaders work with staff members and consider many factors when choosing books to share with the children, such as:
