Our expectations:

Readiness for KS1:

Children will use the correct pencil grip.

Children will sit at a table and use the correct sitting position.

By the end of FS2, children will be able to form all ten digits correctly and accurately.

Readiness for KS2:

The learning goal and the date will be written at the start of each day.

Children will use a pencil and ruler to underline their date and title.

Children use pencil in their maths books.

One digit is written per square.

KS2:

The learning goal and the date will be written at the start of each day.

Children will use a pencil and ruler to underline their date and title.

Children use pencil in their maths books.

One digit is written per square.

A ruler is used when drawing straight lines (e.g. column method, drawing a rectangle, bus stop division etc.)

When sticking sheets in books, they will be folded (if necessary) and glued in neatly.

Children use a different coloured pen or pencil to 'tick and fix' their work.
