Reading

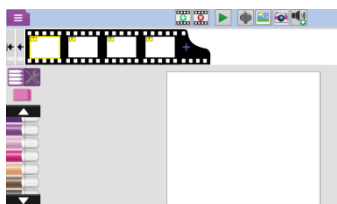

Science

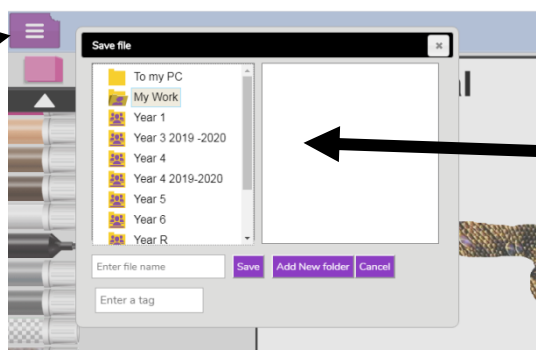
- We are now starting a new Science Topic based on Animals and their Habitats so a lot of the work over the next few weeks will be related to this.

Computing

- Please go onto Purple Mash using your school log in and have a go at some 'Animal' related computing work. Here are some ideas:
 - Create a simple animation involving an animal or a habitat using **2Animate** (this can be found in the Art area on Purple mash)
 - Create a piece of Animal Art Work using **2PaintaPicture** (found in Art area) or **Paint Projects** (found in Science - Animals)
 - Explore **Leaflets and Postcards** and create a leaflet about an animal or habitat or design a post card from a habitat of your choice (Found in Science area - Animals - Leaflets and Postcards)
- Once you have completed a piece of work you are happy with, please save it. I should then be able to view your work and put it onto a class notice board within purple mash for the rest of the class to see!
