Monday: Gingerbread Man Games

Quick starter: Practise counting back from 10 to 0, then from 20 to 0.

Follow the link to play games that involve counting, matching numerals to objects and ordering numbers. Choose a level for each game that you think will be appropriate for your child.

Tuesday: Number Bonds Game

Quick starter: Practise writing numbers to 10.

Show 10 objects on a tray or plate. Ask your child to turn around, then hide some of the objects.

When your child looks at the tray, they have to work out how many objects are missing to score a point!

Play the game again, with your child hiding some of the objects from you.

Wednesday: Top Trumps Game

Quick starter: Order number cards from 0-10, then 10-20.

Shuffle the number cards to 20 (see resources).

Halve the cards and place them face-down in a pile. Give one pile to your child and keep the other. Ask your child to turn over the top card in the pile and name the number.

Turn over the top card in your pile. Ask your child to point to the bigger number. If your child has the bigger number, they win both cards and add them to the bottom of their pile. If your number is bigger, you take both cards.

Continue the game until one player has won all the cards.

Thursday: Numberblocks addition and subtraction game

Quick starter: Show a number card to 20. Ask your child to tell you one more or one less than the number.

Friday: Pairs Game

Quick starter: Say a number from 1 to 5, and ask your child to show double the number on their fingers.

Print off the pairs cards (see resources) or make a similar version at home (your child could help with this).

Spread out the cards, face down.

Take it in turns to turn over two cards. If the cards both equal the same number, you win the pair. If the cards make different numbers, turn them back over.

The winner is the person with the most pairs by the end of the game.

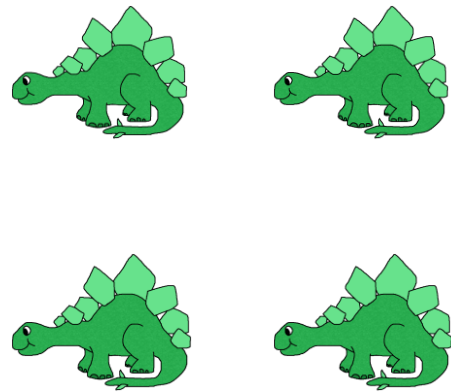

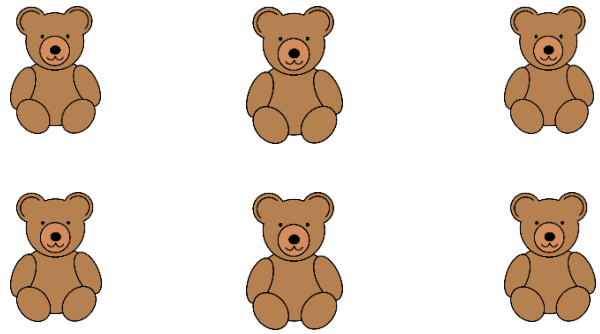

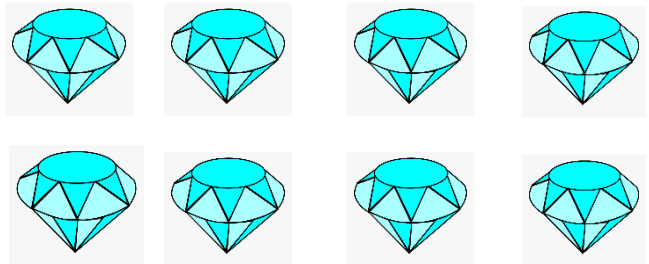
