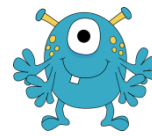




Home Learning

Literacy



Please always remind your child to write in 'good' sentences.

When writing sentences please can you help your child to write 'good' sentences.

This means that a 'good' sentence has a capital letter, finger spaces, a full stop, it makes sense and it is written in neat handwriting.

To make the sentence 'even better' they need to write sentences containing more than 5 words, add some simple adjectives and use a conjunction (if appropriate) to extend their sentence. If you can also try to add a verb in your sentences that would make your sentences fantastic.

Day 1 - Each week we will do this first activity but I will change the sound that we focus on. This week the sound is 'ar' (as in 'start the car'). Use the phonics page for the sound 'ar' that you have in your phonics pack and write some of the 'ar' words at the bottom of the page in sentences. These sentences should be longer than 5 words and include adjectives and a conjunction, if appropriate. If you can think of anymore 'ar' words you could also write some sentences containing these words or write a list.

Day 2 - We have talked about nouns being naming words for a person, place or a thing and this week we are going to be recapping on singular and plural nouns. Using the sheet titled '**Singular and Plural Nouns- adding s for plurals**' write the plurals in the columns. There are two videos to watch explaining about nouns and that when there is more than one it turns from singular to plural by adding the letter s. When this sheet is complete write two sentences for each of some of the nouns e.g. I have one red hat. My friend has got three red hats.

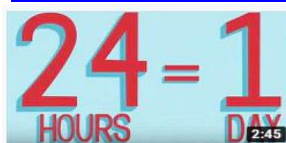

Day 3 - Today we are going to recap on telling the time to o'clock. The big hand (minute hand) always needs to be pointing at the number twelve and the little hand (hour hand) will point to the number of the hour. Look at BBC Bitesize for a quick reminder of how to tell the time.

Numeracy (continued)

Day 4 - Today we are going to recap on telling the time to half past the hour. Remember that the big hand (minute hand) is half the way around the clock and will be pointing to the number 6 and the little hand (hour hand) will be just past the number of the hour. Complete pages 3 and 4 of the resource titled '**O'clock and Half Past**'.

Day 5 - Today we are going to answer some time word problems and if you have time you can try to make some time word problems of your own. The resource to look at today is called '**Time Word Problems**'.



Topic Work



Our new topic for this term is called Holidays.

This week we are going to identify what a holiday is. We usually say that a holiday is when you have time off of school or work. In class we would write a big list of all the things that we like to do on holiday which could include things like: - going to the beach, camping, going to another country, playing in the garden, football, watching TV, playing with toys, baking, going in a pool, going to the caravan, staying in a hotel, building sandcastles, going to the park, etc.
