Dear Class 2

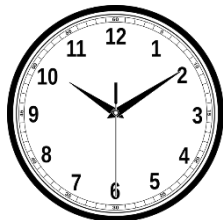

Maths

The focus for your maths work this week is to practise telling the time. This will really help you in Class 3. Use the **week 12 tab** for the video links on White Rose Maths to complete each daily lesson. You'll need to watch the video and complete the related activity sheet which are attached.

You can also practice telling the time by working out how long it is until a meal or activity that you want to do. How long does your favourite programme last? Have a race and time how long it takes you to complete the race.

In addition, remember to practise all the quick recall maths facts you've learnt in school (2, 3, 5 and 10 timetables, doubles and halves of numbers to 20, number bond to 10 and 20 and numbers pairs to 100). The website below has a variety of games for

Literacy

Top tips when writing

- Use careful handwriting leads/joined
- Use careful spellings using your phonic knowledge/dictionary
- Use a clear capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop to punctuate your sentences.
- Try writing in multi-clause sentences using conjunctions.
- Try adding descriptive detail using adjectives, how adverbs (ly) and similes.
- Try to use commas in lists, exclamation marks and question marks correctly.

Topic



Your topic work this week is all about dragons.

Lesson 1: Design a Dragon

It's your turn to design your own dragon! Think carefully about its colour, size and any special characteristics it might have. You could use the **dragon image cards** for inspiration if needed, or find examples of books with dragons in.

Try and add labels to your picture to add detail. Try and use adjectives to help describe the dragon (e.g. scaly skin).

Lesson 2: Writing Activity - My Dragon

Using your dragon design, now write a description of your dragon. Try and write a poem using the same style as the **reading practice**. You could use the **dragon themed writing paper** to make your poem really stand out.

Lesson 3: Caring for a Dragon

Discuss what animals need to survive (food, shelter, water) and what else they might like to have, thinking about any pets that you have (training, to be played with, exercise).

Now think about what a dragon might need and use the **caring for a dragon sheet**. Draw six pictures to explain how to care for a dragon, some of you might want to also write a sentence for each picture.

Lesson 4: Dragon Image Cards

The **image cards** can be used in different ways so choose how you would like to use them.

You could write a description of their favourite dragon, or you could include them in a story.

Or, you could print two copies of the cards and play a matching game.

Take it in turns to describe one of the dragons with another person guessing which one you are describing.

Lesson 5: A Dragon's Nest

Use the **instruction sheet** to create your very own dragon's eggs! Explore using papier mâché to create your very own nest.

Extension Activities (optional):

- Read stories and watch films that include dragons (e.g. Pete's Dragon, How to Train your Dragon, Zog, Room on the Broom, There's a dragon in Your Book, St George and the Dragon) and talk about whether the dragons are good or bad.
- Write your own stories about dragons, based on the one you designed.
- Make a dragon sculpture using junk modelling, playdough or any materials that you have at home.

Reading Tasks

- Lesson 1: Dragons
- Lesson 2: George and the Dragon
- Lesson 3: Knights and Dragons- The text is quite long but choose the appropriate questions for your child.
- Lesson 4: Firey Dragon Jelly
- Lesson 5: Missing Unicorn
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Phonics

For those children still on the phonics programme it is important to continue to read your Read Write Inc books online on the website below. Read books you haven't read the same colour as the books sent home from school.

In addition there are lots of phonics resources as well as links to daily phonics lessons which you can watch.
