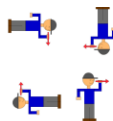

Top tips when writing

- Use careful handwriting leads/joined
- Use careful spellings using your phonic knowledge/dictionary
- Use a clear capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop to punctuate your sentences.
- Try writing in multi-clause sentences using conjunctions.
- Try adding descriptive detail using adjectives, how adverbs (ly) and similes.
- Try to use commas in lists, exclamation marks and question marks correctly.

History



Your topic work this week is all about Gawber and how it has changed over time.

Lesson 1: What does Gawber look like now? A Google Maps activity to find out what Gawber is like now.

Go to Google Maps on www.google.com/maps and type in S75 and move the map around until you can see Gawber.

to compare how Gawber looked in the past. Can you find any of the places from yesterday on the map from 1888-1913? You will probably have to use the zoom function on your browser to see more detail.

Make a list of the things that are the same and those that are different. Why do you think Gawber has changed so much in 200 years? Can you find any other old maps of Gawber on the internet to look at?

Lesson 3: What jobs did people do in Barnsley in the past?

Below is the Barnsley coat of arms. There are two different industries represented (two jobs that many people did in Barnsley in the past). Can you work out what the two jobs are?

This description might help you and one should be quite easy to work out.



On one side of the coat of arms, stands a miner, wearing a hat, carrying a lamp around his neck and carrying a pick axe on top of some coal.

On the other side, stands a glass blower with a blow pipe

See if you can find out where was the nearest place to Gawber where people mined and made glass. The old maps might help you.

Lesson 4: What did people do in Gawber?

A census is taken every 10 years to find out all about the people who live in a place. From these we can find out all about the different jobs that people did and that includes children?

Look at the extract of the 1888 census and answer these questions?

Which job did lots of people who lived in Gawber do?

What do you think a scholar was?

Look at Walter Brook's age. At what age do you think children started working in 1888?

Most houses at the time consisted of one or two rooms. Look at how many people lived in some families. Do you think it would have been nice living like this with your family?

Lesson 5: A Gawber Local History Trail

Normally Mr Exley would take us on a trail around Gawber to see how it has changed and point out some of the things that are the same or different but we can't do that this time!

Have a look at the old map of Gawber and see if you can find some of the things that are marked on the map. There is also a local history board on Redbrook Road just in front of Woodview Lane which will also help you find some of places that used to be in Gawber. Can you find where the glasshouse/kiln used to be?

Extension Activities (optional):

Find out about the jobs that people did?

Ask any relatives who have lived in Gawber for a long time what was it like when they were young?

See if you can find out about Joseph Locke. Why is he famous? Can you find any places in Barnsley that are named after him?
