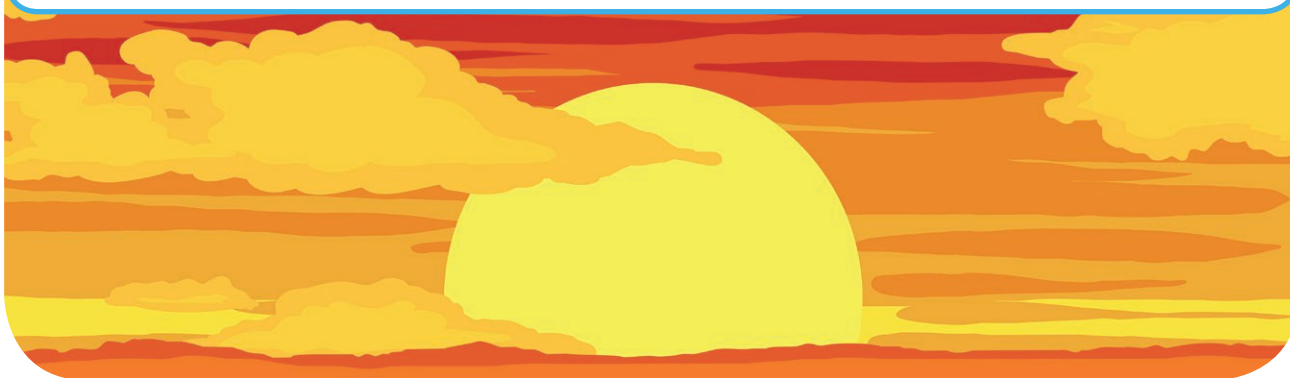


Summer is a season. The summer months are June, July and August.

Summer is a great time for spotting flowers, insects and wildlife.

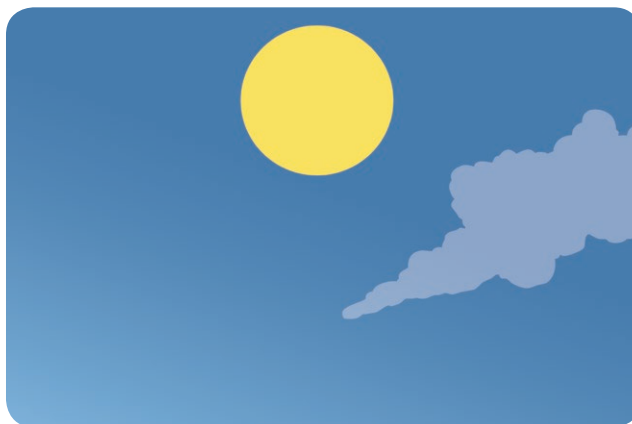
Summer
