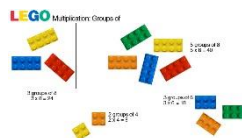

Maths



The focus for your maths work this week is to begin working on division by sharing and grouping. Use the **Summer week 6** tab on White Rose Maths to complete each daily lesson. You'll need to watch the video and complete the related activity sheet which are attached. You can also practise your knowledge of division practically to reinforce the skills you've learnt. Can you group your LEGO or pencils or anything else you can find at home into groups? How many different ways can you share out the same starting number, for example: How many different ways can you share 10 into equal groups?

Literacy

Top tips when writing

- Use careful handwriting leads/joined
- Use careful spellings using your phonic knowledge/dictionary
- Use a clear capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop to punctuate your sentences.
- Try writing in multi-clause sentences using conjunctions.
- Try adding descriptive detail using adjectives, how adverbs (ly) and similes.
- Try to use commas in lists, exclamation marks and question marks correctly.

Science



Your topic work this week is all about the different animals which can be found around the world and to classify the different types of animals.

Lesson 1: Animal story writing task

Reread **The Hare and the Tortoise**, then use the **cartoon template** provided to retell the tale. Draw a picture in each box, thinking carefully about what might go in each and also write a sentence for each box.

Then using a second printout of the same cartoon template, choose two creatures from the **Animals of the World worksheet** and draw a new cartoon story about a race between them. Discuss how the animals might be different and who you would expect to win the race.

Once you have created their cartoon, use this as a plan to write the story in full, using the **writing paper** in the pack.

Lesson 2: Animal Classification activity

Use the **Animal Classification cards** to name and sort the animals into groups. Match the name of the group, its description and three animals that belong in the group. Can you find more examples of animals for each group? This resource might help you. <https://www.dkfindout.com/uk/animals-and-nature/animal-kingdom/>

Lesson 3: Animals of the World worksheet

Use this **worksheet** to label the continents and oceans. These could be written on, or you could cut out and glue the word cards found on page 2 of the worksheet. Then using the picture cards, you should find out which continent each of the animals live on, and add them to the map.

You could also colour the land green and the seas and oceans blue to help them to recognise which part of the map is land and which is sea.

Lesson 4: Animal Alphabet Worksheet

You need to know all of the letters of the alphabet and say them in order.

Use this **worksheet** to practise this.

Can you then find an animal for each letter of the alphabet? (e.g. ant, bee, cat)

Say the words out loud and think about how they might be spelt.

How many animals for each letter can you find? This is an activity that you could complete in short bursts over the week.

Lesson 5: Animal Movement die

Use this **die** to keep active! Cut out the net (template) and use glue or sticky tape to make a cube. You can then roll the die, and complete the activity on the face it shows for a set amount of time (30 seconds or 1 minute). The activities

can be completed inside or outside.

A blank template is included, so you and your adult can make a die showing activities that you choose together.

Extension Activities (optional):

- Listen to the music from 'The Carnival of the Animals' by Camille Saint-Saëns. Can you guess which animal each part of the music represents? Can you make up a dance showing how that animal moves?
- Write a fact file about your favourite animal. Find out:
 - Where does it live?
 - What does it eat?
 - How does it look after its babies?
 - Any interesting facts.
- Create your own puzzle by cutting up our continents map. Colour in the land and sea on a blank copy and cut it up into pieces (with adult supervision). Can you put it back together? Can you name the continents and oceans?
- Draw pictures of your favourite animals using paints, pencils or crayons. Perhaps you could find paintings on the internet of animals and create one in a similar style?
- Have a go at an animal quiz to find out what you know.
