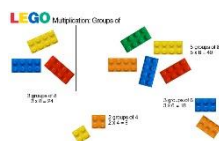

Maths



The focus for your maths work this week is to work on multiplication, a chance to put all those times tables skills to use. begin looking at measure. You can also practise your knowledge of multiplication practically to reinforce the skills you've learnt. Can you group your LEGO or pencils or anything else you can find at home into groups?

Top tips when writing

- Use careful handwriting leads/joined
- Use careful spellings using your phonic knowledge/dictionary
- Use a clear capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop to punctuate your sentences.
- Try writing in multi-clause sentences using conjunctions.
- Try adding descriptive detail using adjectives, how adverbs (ly) and similes.
- Try to use commas in lists, exclamation marks and question marks correctly.

June is Go Wild Month. As well as this week's activities we've also attached some ideas for things that you could do each day this month to make the most of our wonderful nature and the good weather which we have been having.

Science



Your topic work this week is all about the wildlife you might see in your garden or nearby and matching animals with their babies as well as designing your own wildlife garden. We're looking forward to seeing your designs.

Lesson 1: Writing task - A Visitor to the Garden

Reread the **reading practice text**. Discuss how the robin is described.

Using the activity sheet **A Visitor to the Garden**, draw a different bird that might visit the garden. You could use the **Garden Birds Identification Chart** to help if needed. Then continue the story on the sheet, writing a description of the bird. Remember, that this should be in the style of a story, rather than as a list of sentences.

Lesson 2: Identifying birds that might visit your garden.

Use the **Garden Birds Identification Chart** to name birds that come into your garden. if you do not have a garden, you could observe them from your window or whilst out on a walk. Look carefully at the identification chart to find any distinctive patterns or colours that each bird has to help identify them. Use the space at the bottom of the sheet to draw any other birds or animals that you see.

Lesson 3: Garden Babies

Find out about animal babies that you may find in your garden.

Use the **Garden Babies matching cards** to match the adults with their offspring. You could find out about other animal babies and make your own cards.

Lesson 4: Design a garden

Draw your dream garden using the **worksheet** provided or paper that you have at home. This should be drawn as a map. Remember that a map is drawn as if you are looking down on something from above. Think about the map work you did last term. Try and include a key.

Lesson 5: Bird Spotting Journal

Record which birds you see in your garden (or outside your window) daily using this **journal**. Try and label any pictures that you draw and use the **Garden Birds Identification Chart** to name them.

Extension Activities (optional):

- Find out more about different bird species and create a fact file giving information about their habitat, where they nest, food, bird song and how they move.
- Create pictures of different birds, or other visitors to your garden, using paints or pencils. Or perhaps you could create a collage, finding colours from magazines or leaflets that you could cut out to create the feathers of a bird.
- Make a bird feeder to feed the birds in your garden. You can use bird seed, lard and a yoghurt pot to make a tasty treat for your garden visitors. An additional instruction sheet has been included.
- Sort animals into groups. You could cut out the images from the **Garden Birds Identification Chart** or use the adult animal images from the **Garden Babies card match** to sort the animals into mammals, birds, amphibians etc. Or by colour, size, or any other way you would like to sort them.
- Make a bird's nest. An instruction sheet is included.
- Carry out a tally of the birds that you see and complete a bar chart of your results on the template provided.

Reading Tasks

This week's reading is a longer text and may take you all week to complete the activities. Read through the text on day 1 and then reread the text and questions as suggested below.

- Lesson 2: Section 1- Recall
- Lesson 3: Section 2- Vocabulary
- Lesson 4: Section 3- Inference
- Lesson 5: Section 4- Sequencing and predicting



Phonics

For those children still on the phonics programme it is important to continue to read your Read Write Inc books online on the website below. Read books you haven't read the same colour as the books sent home from school.
