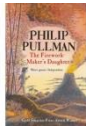
Maths

The focus for your maths work this week is to recap on your knowledge of addition and subtraction. Use the **Summer week 4** tab on White Rose Maths to complete each daily lesson. **You'll need to watch the video and complete the related activity sheet which we have included in the file.** You can also practise counting in tens forwards and backwards from any number, why not try doing this whilst walking or jumping!

Literacy

Top tips when writing

- Use careful handwriting leads/joined
- Use careful spellings using your phonic knowledge/dictionary
- Use a clear capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop to punctuate your sentences.
- Try writing in multi-clause sentences using conjunctions.
- Try adding descriptive detail using adjectives, how adverbs (ly) and similes.
- Try to use commas in lists, exclamation marks and question marks correctly

Science

Your science work is continuation of our topic on keeping healthy. The following are daily activities to complete.

- **Lesson 1: Why do we need to exercise?**

Click through the slides on the power point for lesson 1. Then think about all the different ways you like to exercise. What are your favourite types of exercise? Start to fill your Exercise Log in for this week, recording your favourite exercise on the back page.

- **Lesson 2: How do you keep clean?**

Click through the slides on the power point for lesson 2. Then complete the worksheet 'Keeping Clean' to record all the different ways you keep clean and why it is important to do so. Please note this worksheet is differentiated so please print off the most appropriate for your child.

- **Lesson 3: How do you wash your hands?**

Washing our hands is an important way to keep clean. We wash our hands many times each day but why is using soap important? Try the experiment below to find out why.

- Can you match the thought, feeling or behaviour to the action that would support positive mental health? (see extension lesson 5)

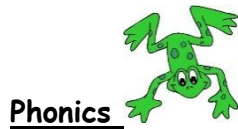
- Can you design your own hand wash bottle? (See extension lesson 3)
